Secretary Report:

- District 5 is ahead of last year's membership renewal
- ND has 18 certified members on the suspended list
- ND is lowest in the district
(SD=27, IA=67, KS=41, MO=82, NE=33, OK=32)
- NATA is moving into new building, sold the old one and will not have to pay any money for the new bldg

Treasurer Report:

- Talked about states ability to increase dues
- ND needs to let Dist. 5 know if we are interested in increasing dues; (decrease licensure fees and increase membership dues so we can be better funded for political issues)
- \$20 per membership goes to state & \$20 goes to Dist. 5 mtg.
(Dist 7 is the only other district that does this)
- (Otherwise approximate cost of district mtg would cost approx. \$150/person)

- Eve Becker Doyle has retired after 20 years of service as Exec/Dir
- David Saddler is new NATA Executive Director
- NATA is looking for Secondary School
- (AT's) These initials are going to be pushed; ex. PT's, OT's
- New NATA Logo to be introduced in Las Vegas in June
- Working on enforcing head-to-head rules
- NATA is looking for any helmet-to-helmet video if you have any
- NATA Hill Day: over 100 AT's went to Capital Hill

Old Business

Committees

We disbanded 3 committees

Updating bylaws and aligning with district and state needs to be done

The research committee chair position is open

A new committee – Annual Meeting Committee- they will organize year to year to ease work for chairs and improve annual meetings; Robin moves to approve; Rachel seconds; motion carries; If no one volunteers Sara will pick ☺

Accountant – to do taxes every year; \$50/year

Century Code – Grass roots efforts & lobbyist (Shane from Odney) hired from November 1 – May 15th cost \$9,500; Your local legislators need to be contacted to push the importance of how they are helping Athletic Training; ND licensure board and NDATA board will meet in July to figure out the next steps; We are trying to match with NATA and MAATA century codes;

Damian Schlinger from Sanford in Bismarck has really contributed to the Grass Roots efforts – Thank you!; More fund raising for Grass Roots; Plan a Capitol Hill day for advertisement and promotion; Our next attempt will be in 2 years

New Business

Bylaws Addition – in the 3rd year of the president's term they want to reimburse the president to attend Board Meetings at MAATA; after 3 years of presidency then they automatically go to the executive director position;

Brenda Potter motions the president gets reimbursed for the District meeting Brad Reed seconds; no discussion; motion carries

Constitutional Amendment – remove “US postal mail” from Section 2 wording on election and voting; Update email list; Build profile on NDATA website to keep everyone's information updated; Ray Hall moves to approve the wording change; Scott Witte seconds; no discussion; motion carries

-Another constitutional amendment addressing for who can run for president; Currently says someone has to be a member of the NDATA for 5 years – we are wanting to get rid of this to open the nomination field; more information being sent out

Increasing dues – NDATA member dues going through NATA increase by \$10; decrease licensure board by \$10 so the cost will be the same to you; JD needs to bring it to the BOD at the District to change it; Licensure board cannot pay for lobbyist, their funds basically pay for travel for board members; Increased dues will pay for lobbyist, travel, conferences, grass roots efforts, etc.

Jeff Bjerke makes a motion for JD talk to District BOD Nikki German seconds; discussion – find AT's in the state that are not NATA members to get them part of the NDATA; motion carries

For concussion legislation – at every conference there will be a concussion component; can be very broad and general; it will be marked on your certificate that you attended the concussion information so the 2 year required training

Robin Tracy moves to approve at each meeting Rachel seconds; amended by Jeff Bjerke to word “depending on the state law” Robin includes this in her original motion; possibly putting on the website to make more available; no more discussion; motion carries that at a minimum the annual conference will cover concussion requirements set forth by state law
